PROGRAM & SERVICES



Housing Stability

Our Housing Stability Program offers emergency support and short-term case management for households facing the threat of eviction, foreclosure, or utility disconnection.



Emergency Family Shelter

Our Emergency Family Shelter offers support to families experiencing homelessness. During their stay, families focus on achieving self-sufficiency and finding permanent housing solutions.



Severe Weather Activation Program (SWAP)

Our Severe Weather Activation Program offers essential motel vouchers to individuals facing unsheltered homelessness during severe weather conditions.



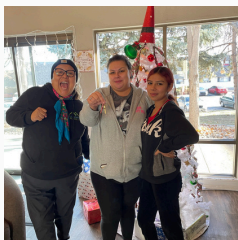
Street Outreach

Our Street Outreach Program offers engagement and case management services aimed at linking individuals facing unsheltered homelessness to housing, shelter, and essential support services.



Rapid Re-Housing

Our Rapid Re-Housing Programs offer rental assistance along with continuous supportive, home-based case management services aimed at helping clients attain housing stability and long-term self-sufficiency.



Respite Housing

Our Respite Housing Program offers immediate diversion services for those experiencing situational homelessness. This includes motel vouchers for a two-week stay, with flexibility for longer durations for households escaping domestic violence.



Housing Navigation Center (HNC)

Our Housing Navigation Center offers support to walk-in participants facing housing instability. We provide on-site resource navigation, referrals to our programs and partner organizations, and essential resources such as access to computers, printing services, mail assistance, as well as food and hygiene kits.

Lives being transformed.....



After more than two years in the SafeLot program in Adams County, Linzy received something life-changing — the keys to a 2003 Toyota Sienna, generously donated by Linda B.

Soon after being laid off in late 2025, Linzy's car broke down.

Even after finding new work, he faced a four-hour round-trip bus ride each day just to make it to his job. On February 6, 2026, Almost Home helped connect Linda's donation to Linzy, giving him not just transportation, but renewed stability, independence, and hope for the road ahead.

A client found herself facing an urgent and frightening situation. She and her children were just days away from being evicted by her ex-partner and needed immediate help.

Through swift coordination and available resources, Almost Home was able to enroll the family and secure new housing the very same day the eviction was expected. Instead of living out of their vehicle, the client, her children, and her mother moved safely into stable housing. She shared deep gratitude for the rapid support — a powerful reminder that when our community comes together, families can move from crisis to safety and renewed hope.



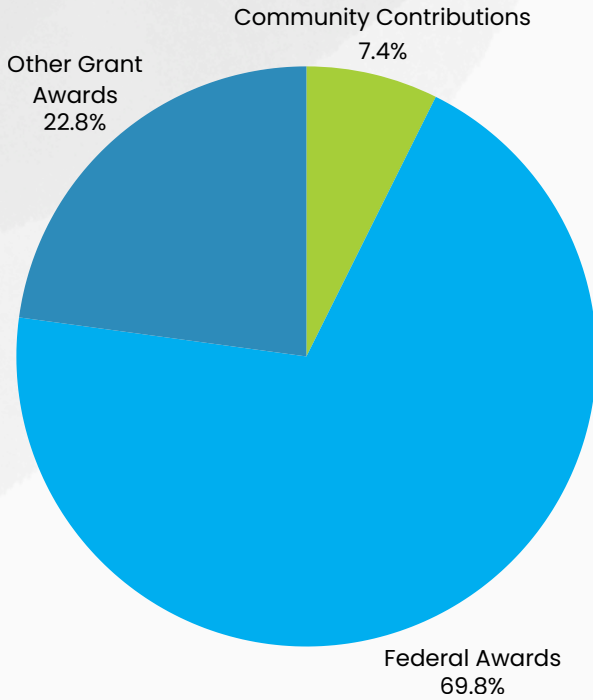
When an injury forced Jackie to miss work, she lost her job and quickly fell behind on rent, fearing she might lose her home. Through Almost Home's Housing Stability Program, she received rental assistance that allowed her to stay housed and avoid eviction. With that stability, Jackie can now move forward with needed foot surgery and focus on getting back to work. She shared that knowing she can remain safely in her home is "the most amazing feeling," adding, "Thank you from the bottom of my heart—you are angels in my life."

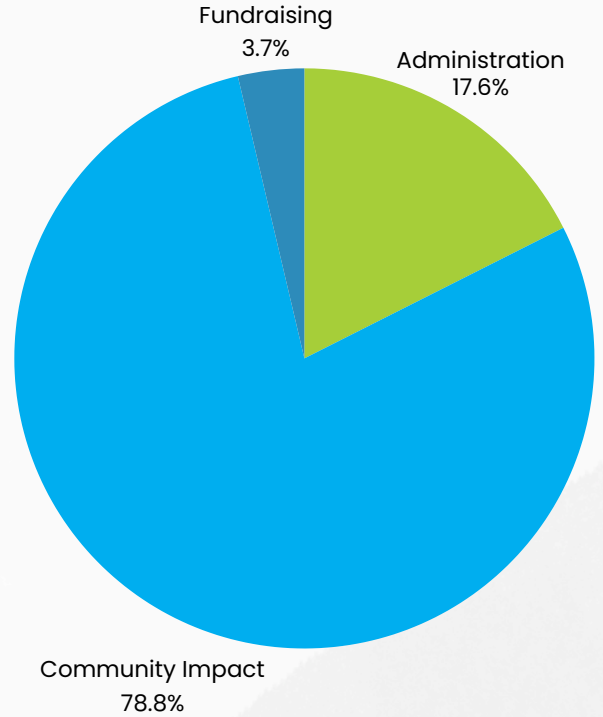

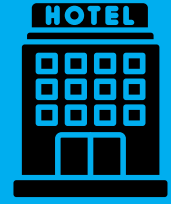
Housing Stability Program

- 92% exited into permanent housing

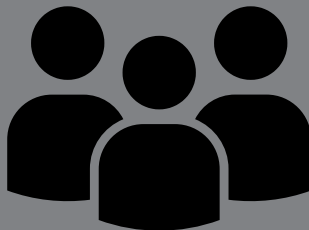

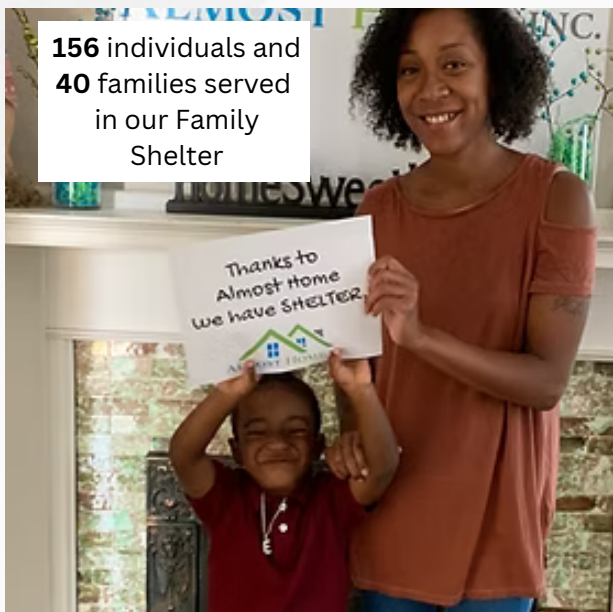

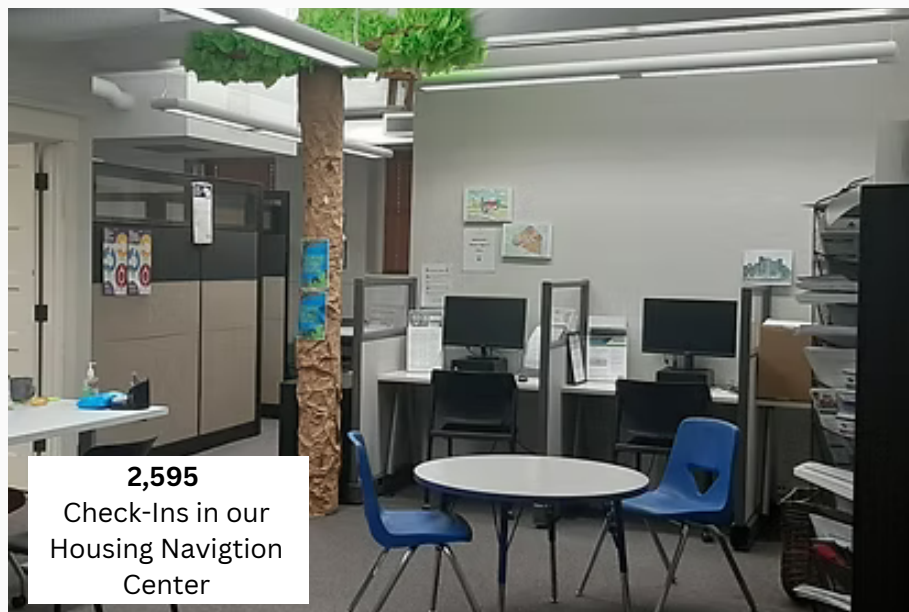

SWAP Familiar Faces began in March 2025 and serves to rehouse SWAP's top utilizers- individuals who have spent the most time sheltered through SWAP. This program acts as a long-term solution for SWAP participants because it assists them in obtaining and maintaining safe, stable housing. We successfully rehoused 3 households and continue to grow the program.
